

PLAN & PREPARE

▶ College Readiness Courses

Make sure students are taking the right courses and challenging themselves. Taking Honors, Advanced Placement (AP), Dual Enrollment, or other rigorous college readiness courses can give students the best chance of college readiness.

► ACT® Resources

- Get2College's ACT® prep workshops provide live, virtual instruction on ACT® prep.
- The Get2College Guidebook for the ACT® is a guide to study tips, test-taking strategies, and practice questions to prepare for the ACT®.

► Types of Colleges

College is any education after high school that leads to financial stability. A good college fit is when a college meets a student's academic, social, and financial preferences. Students may pursue a one-year, non-degree credential/certificate, a two-year associate degree, or a four-year Bachelor's Degree and beyond. Mississippi offers a wide range of colleges to choose from, including public or private, community college or four-year institutions, Historically Black Colleges And Universities, online programs, and religious affiliations. Use Get2College's college comparison tool with your students to learn about and compare colleges – see student body demographics, graduation rate, costs of attendance, and more.

Resume Information for Students

Your students' resumes should be an opportunity to showcase their extracurricular activities, academic programs, honors, awards, leadership skills, and summer jobs or internships. Students should begin building their high school resume as a freshman and continually add to it each school year.

Career Planning

PAY

▶ Federal Aid

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) form is required to receive any federal funds. Federal funds include the PELL grant, need-based and non-need-based grants, work-study programs, and student loans. We've compiled information to help students navigate and complete the 2023-24 FAFSA.

State Aid

There is FREE money for students who attend college in Mississippi. Learn about MTAG, MESG, HELP Grant, and FAITH on our website.

Scholarship Tool

Students can search for Mississippi and national scholarships using Get2College's scholarship tool. Use the tool's filters, as some scholarships could fit your school type, field of study, and race and ethnicity.

Calculators

- Use the College Savings Calculator to understand what college costs now and in the future and estimate how much money students need to save.
- Use the Loan Repayment Calculator to estimate what a student will owe on student loans after graduation and calculate the monthly bill.
